## ABOUT THE POSITION:

*The Wire* is seeking a full-time staff writer to cover China, business, economics and finance, and also to work with us on investigative projects. Staff writers would write 900 to 1,000 word feature stories, as well as magazine-length cover stories of 3,000 words. The magazine publishes in-depth journalism and is focused on one of the most important stories of our time: the rise of China as a business and economic power, and how it engages with the outside world. Reporters would be expected to cover events in Washington, to write about private equity, artificial intelligence, technology startups and multinational corporations. Candidates should have some news writing or journalism experience, and a general understanding of business reporting.

*The Wire* is a digital news magazine dedicated to understanding and explaining one of the biggest stories of our time: China's economic rise, and its influence on global business, finance, trade, labor and the environment. The weekly publication — founded by David Barboza, who earned two Pulitzer Prizes while serving as the Shanghai correspondent for *The New York Times* — relies on a diverse, independent group of journalists and columnists stationed around the globe.
